The School of Planning in the College of Design, Architecture, Art, and Planning at the University of Cincinnati is seeking candidates to fill a tenure track, nine-month Assistant Professor position beginning in August 2017 focused on research, teaching and service in the area of **Transportation Planning and Economic Development**. The University of Cincinnati is a major public research university with an enrollment of more than 44,000 students, \$400 million in annual research funding (Carnegie classified "Doctoral University: Highest Research Activity") and designated as "Among the Top Tier of the Best National Universities," according to U.S. News & World Report.

The School of Planning prepares professionals for distinguished practice and spatially-based approaches with a focus on livable places, and the creation of communities that enrich people's lives. The four academic programs within the School of Planning (Bachelor in Urban Planning, Bachelor of Science in Urban Studies, Masters of Community Planning, and PhD in Urban and Regional Futures) offer specific coursework about the planning and design of innovative futures for urban communities and regions. The School of Planning's graduate planning program is ranked 4th in the Midwest and 17th in North America by Planetizen.

Job Description:

- Full time teaching load at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the areas of Transportation planning and Economic Development;
- Candidate will be expected to conduct research on transportation planning and economic development topics, and other topics relevant to cities and urban living, secure external funding, and produce peer-reviewed publications;
- Full time faculty members are expected to serve on various school, college, and/or University committees and carry some degree of administrative responsibility for curriculum development.

Minimum Qualifications:

Candidate must have a PhD in planning or a doctoral degree in a related discipline such as **economics, geography, engineering, or public policy**. The candidate must have a research background in Transportation Planning and Economic Development.
