

The 9th COTA-World Bank China Transport Forum Clean and Intelligent Urban Mobility

Purpose: The COTA-World Bank China Transport Forum is a yearly event jointly organized by COTA and the World Bank at the annual COTA International Conference of Transportation Professionals (CICTP). The Forum aims to: (i) highlight critical challenges and opportunities in China's transport development; and (ii) serve as a platform for knowledge and best practices sharing among COTA members, government officials, researchers, educators and practitioners from China and abroad.

Forum Description: The 9th COTA-WB China Transport Forum will be hosted by **Tsinghua University** in Beijing **on July 8, 2018,** and organized by **COTA, World Bank and World Resources Institute (WRI)**. This year's forum will be titled **Clean and Intelligent Urban Mobility** focusing on urban public transport infrastructure, emerging technologies, and advanced mobility services. It is a comprehensive topic of increasing importance in transportation development. The forum will feature national and international experts, Chinese officials, scholars and practitioners who will discuss the challenges and opportunities of applying the technologies in green urban mobility. The forum will focus on the real world experiences and best practices of new energy bus, non-motorized urban mobility, and infrastructure digitalization both in China and around the world.
