INTRODUCTION

By the end of 2015, the worldwide population reached 7.2 billion, heading to hit 100 million vehicles by 2020. Despite decades of tremendous efforts on research and practices, congestion, emissions and energy use continue soaring as population and economy grow, letting alone escalating threats of climate change to infrastructure systems. These problems will become worse as adding capacity becomes increasingly difficulty due to land and fiscal constraints.

To address these challenges, innovative tools and forward-looking strategies are required to ensure the sustainability, livability and resiliency of the multi-modal transportation systems.
